The **Advanced Placement** program is designed so that if you have all of the prerequisite courses completed you can complete the BS in one full year of study. This may be difficult to do because of your work schedule and family responsibilities. You can space out your coursework and timing on an individual basis.

Required Courses for the *Baccalaureate in Nursing – Advanced Placement Track*

The following pre-requisite courses may be taken at Rutgers, transferred in from another college, waived, or challenged. A maximum of 64 credits from a two-year college may be applied toward the Rutgers nursing baccalaureate degree. The RN who has passed NCLEX will be granted 23 nursing challenge credits (in lieu of *Nursing II & III and Psych nursing*) in addition to the 64 transfer credits. The student’s last 33 credits must be taken at Rutgers.
